The Director of Development serves as a visible and inspiring representative of DCT in the community and plays a pivotal role in building and nurturing relationships that advance the organization's mission.

This is a pivotal moment in DCT's evolution—following the appointment of a new Artistic Director and the launch of a bold strategic plan (Vision 2030), the theater is investing in growth, innovation, and long-term sustainability. Key Responsibilities

Leadership & Strategy

- Develop, execute, and evaluate an annual fundraising plan that aligns with institutional goals and long-term sustainability.
- Provide strategic direction and oversight across all development initiatives, including major gifts, annual giving, grants, sponsorships, and special events.
- Manage a contributed revenue goal of \$3 million annually in collaboration with the Executive Director and development team.
- Oversee the development department budget, forecasting revenue and ensuring accurate reporting.
- Partner closely with the Executive Director, Artistic Director, and Board of Trustees to engage, cultivate, and solicit major gifts and expand the organization's philanthropic network.
- Serve as a key member of the senior leadership team, contributing to organizational planning and decision-making.
